


BACKGROUND TO THE STUDY

Raphoe town has had a history of serious flooding, the most recent in August 2023. Flooding in Raphoe is caused by intense, localised rainfall events generating surface water run-off from the steep hillsides above the town, causing widespread disruption and damage to properties and businesses. This flood risk is well documented and has been subject to hydrological and hydraulic analysis, flood risk assessment, public consultation, and development of a preferred option.

The Office of Public Works (OPW) in partnership with Donegal County Council, have commissioned the Raphoe Flood Relief Scheme to address flooding in the town.

The Scheme identified includes measures to intercept and divert surface water before it reaches the areas at risk. An overview of the Scheme can be seen in the image below:



Will the Scheme be protected against climate change?

The FRS is not being designed for climate change levels from the outset as there is significant uncertainty in what these are, and the impact to the Scheme could be unnecessarily large.

The analysis includes a full assessment of the level of present-day flood risk and flood risk under the midrange future climate change scenario. The Scheme is designed for the present-day scenario with an extra allowance for uncertainty, referred to as 'freeboard', which is typically provided as additional height on a wall or embankment.

WHAT IS HAPPENING NOW?

The Public Exhibition provided the public with an opportunity to comment on the proposals. The Project Team responded to all the comments and amended the Scheme as necessary. The Scheme documentation has since been submitted to the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform for approval.

The Project Team are currently going through the process of procuring contractors to undertake the ground investigation works and surveys. These contractors will be working throughout Raphoe in the coming months to obtain the information needed to inform the detailed design.

A review of the recent flooding is also being undertaken and the next newsletter will provide an update on that event.

NEXT STEPS

The Minister will undertake an independent review of the environmental assessments of the Scheme before considering making an Order of Confirmation.

Concurrently, the Scheme will go through the detailed design process once the ground investigation and survey data has been received.

Should the Scheme successfully pass through these stages, the construction of the Scheme works will commence shortly afterwards.
